And beginning this year, we now have schoolwide involvement with every elementary student paired with a middle schooler (3rd & 6th grade, 4th & 7th grade, and 5th & 8th grade). These fun relationships allow for mentoring, friendship, and bridging our elementary and middle schools. Buddies engage in a variety of activities together, such as games, scavenger hunts, and bowling. Students have enjoyed meeting and getting to know their buddies this vear!





Innovative Curriculum - Experiential Learning Arts & Cultural Integration

INSIDE THE MAGELLAN CLASSROOM

In **3rd grade** ELA, students read the book *Stone Fox*. As they worked on envisioning, students chose a favorite scene and created dioramas to bring their vision to life.





In **4th grade** science - as part of their study of animal habitats and adaptations - each student was assigned an animal to research. As part of their presentation, students created their animals using papier mache, which was displayed at our Zooseum!





In **5th grade** science, students have been learning about the ways heat transfers through conduction, convection and radiation. Students pulled their knowledge together by planning, designing, building and testing solar ovens. The outcome came in the form of delicious s'mores!





In **6th grade** social studies, students are studying Ancient Egypt. Students became cartographers creating their own maps to reference throughout the unit, especially as they explore the impact of the Nile River on ancient Egyptians. Students will also get to explore Egyptian mummification and art immersion!





In **7th grade** social studies, students have been studying the Renaissance where they explored famous Renaissance figures and the new techniques artists employed in their works. In the spirit of the era, 7th graders made fresco paintings on plaster.





In **8th grade** ELA, students read and studied *The Outsiders*. They compared themes from the novel to other works and participated Socratic seminars to dive deeper into the topics. To conclude, 8th grade celebrated Outsiders Day! Dressed as Greasers and Socs, they enjoyed a 1960s celebration with dancing, karaoke, and a screening of the film.





8TH GRADE VOYAGE: CAROLINA BEACH

Eighth grade visited
Carolina Beach where they engaged in several scientific coastal activities.
They enjoyed a boat ride to a N.C. estuary, tried their hand at crabbing and net fishing, hunted for North Carolina seashells, and even dissected a squid!









7TH GRADE VOYAGE: ESCAPE ROOM

The 7th grade team went on their first voyage of the year to an escape room! There, they had to work together as a team in order to solve puzzles and riddles that led to their escape. The students (and teachers) had lots of fun trying their hand at becoming escape artists!









6TH GRADE VOYAGES: CAMP HANES & DURANT NATURE PARK

Sixth grade embarked on the first overnight voyage of the year. At Camp Hanes, students enjoyed activities such as zip-lining, canoeing, hiking, and archery.

Overnight voyages allow students the opportunity to explore, experience, bond, and build independence.

Sixth graders also visited Durant Nature Park where they netted samples from the lake ecosystem and simulated a forest food web.









5TH GRADE VOYAGE: NC MUSEUM OF ART

Fifth graders spent a cool fall day at the North Carolina Museum of Art Park where they rotated through a variety of activities focusing on science, art, and movement. They practiced yoga, tried their hand at sketching, and enjoyed a picnic lunch together.









4TH GRADE VOYAGE: N.C. ZOO

Fourth grade students took their animal studies outside of the classroom and voyaged to the North Carolina Zoo. They observed various animal species and their habitats, and completed a scavenger hunt. Many of the animals were active and it was a beautiful day to enjoy them.









3RD GRADE VOYAGE: YATES MILL PARK

Third graders went on their first voyage as Mariners to Historic Yates Mill Park, the last operable water powered mill in Wake County. Students went on a nature walk, completed a scavenger hunt, and enjoyed homemade ice cream from the Howling Cow. Yum!
