PROMOTING A CULTURE OF COMPASSION GRADE BY GRADE

In **3rd grade**, students held their annual Spread the Love event, where students rotated through stations to make cards for first responders, bookmarks for donated children's books, and fleece blankets for The Linus Project.



Our **4th grade** team partnered with the Ronald McDonald House for Thanksgiving.

Students collected food and supplies for families who have traveled far from home for their children's medical care.



Our **5th grade** entrepreneurs raised money for the Make-A-Wish Foundation. From bake sales, lemonade stands, dog walking and more, they raised over \$7,800 to grant the wish of a local child.



Beginning this trimester, our **6th grade** team will be collecting items to make birthday baskets for the Smiling While Sending Hope organization whose mission is to provide joy and comfort to those in hard times..



In the fall, our **7th grade** gleaned a North Carolina sweet potato field - successfully bagging 550 bags of sweet potatoes, which equals about 18,000 servings! All were donated to serve local families experiencing food insecurity.



8th graders serve our MCS community by collecting recycling from all over the school each week and by assisting with carpool. On February 27th, they will host a BINGO BASH charity fundraiser to raise money for an organization of their choosing - look for more details soon!




8TH GRADE VOYAGE: CAROLINA BEACH


